The manuscript must include the following elements:

Title: The title should be concise and clear.

Author Names: Full names of the authors must be provided, followed by the institution they are affiliated with and their email addresses.

Keywords: Include 4–5 carefully chosen keywords that accurately reflect the subject of the paper.

Abstract: The abstract should present the core of the paper and its conclusions in 150–200 words. It must be written in English.

Introduction: The introduction should briefly describe the foundation of the presented work. It should also state the objectives, reasons for undertaking the study, and its significance.

Materials and Methods: This section should detail the materials and methods used in the study. The information must be sufficient to allow replication of the work in the same field.

Results and Discussion: Results should be clearly presented and illustrated using tables, graphs (where necessary), and examples. The study's findings should be statistically analyzed, and conclusions should be drawn based on statistical reliability. The implications of the presented results must be thoroughly discussed.

Conclusions: Conclusions must be directly related to the obtained results. They should not be speculative or generalized from the literature or general knowledge.

Bibliography: Literature sources must be listed numerically in alphabetical order based on the first author's last name. The paper should include a reasonable number of references (15–20). If a source is cited as "in press," it indicates that the work has been accepted for publication. Manuscripts not accepted for publication cannot be cited. References from the internet are not accepted unless they are online scientific publications.

The bibliography must be up-to-date and include recent works in the respective field of study.
